Keynote Speaker: Catherine McTamane **"Democracy and Peace: Why the World Needs Montessori Now."**

A timely discussion focusing on the ways in which Montessori education affirms the dignity of the individual and demands our commitment to peaceful communities.

Catherine McTamane is an esteemed educator, author, and Professor at Vanderbilt University's Peabody College, widely recognized for her expertise in Montessori education and her philosophy of compassionate teaching. A triple graduate of Peabody herself, Dr. McTamane has built a distinguished career primarily at Vanderbilt, where she instructs undergraduate students in teacher licensure programs, concentrating on the social and political background of public education and integrating the arts into classroom environments.

Her influence extends far beyond the university lecture halls. As a respected Montessori lecturer, she travels internationally to speak, and she serves as a significant voice in the educational community through her books, including the reflective works *The Tao of Montessori: Reflections on Compassionate Teaching* and *A Delicate Task: Living, Learning and Teaching on a Montessori Path* and, most recently, *Only Poets and Little Children*. She reaches a global audience through her established blog, "Montessori Daoshi" (www.montessoridaoshi.com), which shares insights on living and teaching through a Montessori lens.

In recognition of her contributions to the field, she was the founding recipient of the American Montessori Society's Montessori Innovator Award in 2020. Her academic excellence and dedication to the university community were further celebrated when she received the Vanderbilt University Thomas Jefferson Award in 2023. She has also served as a visiting scholar at the MIT Media Lab, where she collaborated on designing the Wildflower Schools project, a network of decentralized Montessori micro-schools, and has consulted for the St. Nicholas Montessori Foundation in London. She was a Montessori child and is a Montessori mom to two, including one more generation of Montessori teachers.
